The Customer views and selects upload audio. 4. The System asks the Customer to start the audio recording and end the audio recording when they are done. 5. The customer then uploads audio for the family to see 6. The system then saves the audio file and notifies the customer when the upload is complete 														
Extensions:	4a. User Never Ends Audio 4a1. The System alerts the user that they never ended audio creation and will pause the recording 4a2. The Customer resumes the recording and returns to step 5 of normal flow.

Trigger:	The Customer indicates to create accounts for other family members.																			
Description:	The Customer wants to create accounts for the other family members so that they can post audio to the family feed and listen to other family member’s audio recordings.																			
Preconditions:	PRE-1. A customer has already created a “Family Head” account on the website.																			
Postconditions:	POST-1. Accounts are created and the credentials are uploaded to the system.																			
Main Success Scenario:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The Customer indicates to create family user accounts. 2. The System retrieves the specified request and displays it to the Customer. 3. The Customer chooses to change the details of this request. 4. The System asks the Customer to provide details required to add accounts where allowed according to “Details” defined in Associated Information and “Security/access concerns” defined in Business Rules of this use case. 5. The Customer makes changes to this request until confirming that she has finished changing. 6. The System validates the Customer’s changes and alerts warning messages according to “Details” defined in Associated Information of this use case. 																			
Extensions:	6a. Input validation rule violation 6a1. The System alerts the Customer that an input validation rule is violated and displays the nature and location of the error. 6a2. The Customer corrects the mistake and returns to step 6 of normal flow.

Preconditions:	PRE-1. The customer needs to be the owner of the voice recording, or the family leader.		
Postconditions:	POST-1. The request is updated in the system with a status of "Hid by customer."		
Main Success Scenario:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The Customer indicates to hide a submitted voice recording. 2. The System retrieves the specified request. 3. The Customer views the details of the request and is given two options to either cancel or hide. 4. The Customer confirms the hiding. 5. The System marks the request as "Hide by customer." 6. The System places the voice recording in the "Hidden recordings" tab 7. Use case ends. 		
Extensions:	7a. Hiding someone elses voice recording 7a1. They will be able to find their hidden voice recording through the FAQ in voice recordings tab or their personal recordings feed with a flair
